

FOOD STORE SANITATION LAW
(Section 69-1-18, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended)

Regulation 1.0 Sanitation Requirements.

The sanitation regulations for retail food stores shall be the same as the sanitation requirements for food establishments published by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services in the 2001 *Food Code* unless otherwise noted in subsequent regulations.

Regulation 1.1 MDAC Additions to and Exclusions from the 2001 *Food Code* (additions underlined and exclusions lined through).

A. Chapter 1, Subpart 1-201.10(B)(36)(a):

- a) "**Food establishment**" means an operation that stores, prepares, packages, serves, vends, or otherwise provides FOOD for human consumption for pay:

B. Chapter 1, Subpart 1-201.10(B)(36)(b)(ii):

- b) "**Food establishment**" includes:

(i) An element of the operation such as a transportation vehicle or a central preparation facility that supplies a vending location or satellite feeding location *unless the vending or feeding location is PERMITTED by the REGULATORY AUTHORITY*; and

(ii) An operation that is conducted in a mobile, stationary, temporary, or permanent facility or location; where consumption is on or off the PREMISES; ~~and regardless of whether there is a charge for the FOOD.~~

C. ~~Chapter 8, "Compliance and Enforcement:"~~

The Department of Agriculture and Commerce does not adopt the procedures in Chapter 8 of the *Food Code*. The Department's compliance and enforcement procedures are found in Miss. Code Ann. §69-1-18 (Rev. 2005) and Regulation # 5.
