

## Chapter 27 Eligibility of Members on Inactive Status for Total and Permanent Disability Retirement Benefits

### 100 Purpose

The purpose of this regulation was to clarify the eligibility for total and permanent disability retirement benefits of members who had withdrawn from employment and who were on inactive status at the time of application.

~~101 Persons with four or more years of creditable service who have withdrawn from active membership, are not eligible for total and permanent disability retirement unless disability occurs within six months of the termination of their active public employment, or unless proof, satisfactory to the Board of Trustees of the Public Employees' Retirement System, is presented showing that the disability claimed was the direct cause of withdrawal from covered public employment. Persons who withdraw as active members and who have obtained employment in a regular normal gainful occupation in any non-covered employment shall not be eligible for total and permanent disability.~~

This regulation was repealed by the Board of Trustees as this provision was covered in the comprehensive disability provisions of Regulation 45A.
