CHAPTER 19 - Wildebeest associated Malignant Catarrhal Fever in  
Cattle.

Disease Outbreak

100 Due to a recent outbreak of Wildebeest associated Malignant Catarrhal Fever (MCF) in cattle, resulting in at least 5 cattle deaths, and due to the fact that Wildebeest associated MCF is a foreign animal disease in the United States and due to the fact that responding to this disease is extremely expensive and requires the destruction of infected animals, it is necessary to enact an emergency rule to protect the Mississippi cattle industry. (Adopted May 2, 2008).

Registration

101 It is hereby ordered that the owners of all Wildebeests residing within the State of Mississippi register same with the Mississippi Board of Animal Health immediately. In addition, no Wildebeests may move within the state of Mississippi without a permit from the State Veterinarian and all Wildebeests must be prevented from having nose to nose contact with cattle or bison.
