The Mississippi Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks, at a meeting in Jackson, Mississippi on April 8, 2010, under authority of Section 25-43-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, made known its intent to adopt the following wildlife management area regulations for the 2010-11 hunting year. This was done under authority of Sections 49-5-13 and 49-7-31, Mississippi Code of 1972.

Be it ordered that Public Notice Number W14 3446 is hereby repealed, and the following 2010-11 wildlife management area hunting regulations are adopted.

**SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR DIVIDE SECTION WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT AREA
PUBLIC NOTICE OF INTENT NUMBER W15 3446(I)**

WMA USER PERMIT: All persons using this wildlife management area, except those exempt from purchasing an annual hunting or fishing license, must carry on their person an annual statewide Wildlife Management Area User Permit. This permit is required in addition to the daily visitor use permit and any required license and may be purchased wherever licenses are sold.

BAG LIMIT: Same as statewide bag limits EXCEPT:
Deer - one legal buck and two does per license year.
Turkey - two legal gobblers per license year.

PERMIT STATIONS: All visitors must obtain a DAILY VISITOR USE PERMIT card from a self-service permit station. Parts A and B of this permit must be legibly filled out before using the WMA. Part A of the permit must be deposited in the return box at a permit station before using the WMA. Part B must be displayed on the dash of the vehicle so that the name, address, and date are visible from outside the vehicle. Permits are invalid if not properly dated or if date has been changed. Before leaving the WMA, visitors must complete the reverse side of Part B of the permit and deposit it in the return box at a permit station. It is the responsibility of the Area Manager and other Agency personnel to have permit cards completed.

LEGAL BUCKS: Legal bucks are those with an inside spread of at least 12 inches OR one main beam length of at least 15 inches. For hunters less than 16 years of age, a legal buck may be any buck.

DEER DATA COLLECTION: All deer harvested must be checked at a check station by the hunter who harvested them before leaving the WMA. If WMA personnel are not available to check the deer, the hunter is responsible for collecting and legibly recording ALL biological data. Instructions and equipment will be provided.

DOG RESTRICTIONS: Deer hunting with dogs is prohibited. Small game hunting with dogs is allowed during any small game season. Hog hunting with dogs is allowed during daylight hours from Feb. 1 - Feb. 28, 2011.

YOUTH/HANDICAPPED DEER HUNTING: Only youth and handicapped hunters are allowed to deer hunt on the Jackson Camp Peninsula (see map). Only handicapped hunters on the Jackson Camp Peninsula will be allowed ATV access each day of the deer seasons and vehicular access on Sundays, Mondays, and Tuesdays during the gun and primitive weapon seasons. All youth and handicapped hunters must pre-register by contacting the District One Office (662-840-5172).

JACKSON CAMP PENINSULA TURKEY HUNTING: Only handicapped hunters will be allowed to turkey hunt this area on Sundays, Mondays, and Tuesdays. Handicapped hunters will be allowed ATV and vehicular access on those days. On Wednesday through Saturday of each week, all hunters are allowed to hunt but access will be by foot traffic only. All handicapped hunters must pre-register by contacting the District One Office (662-840-5172).

LEGAL WEAPONS: On the Youth and Handicapped Area (Jackson Camp Peninsula), only centerfire rifles, shotguns with slugs, primitive weapons, and centerfire handguns may be used for deer hunting. Youth may use centerfire rifles and shotguns with slugs during youth gun and primitive weapon seasons on the entire WMA. The entire area, excluding Jackson Camp Peninsula, is archery and/or primitive weapon only during all other deer seasons. Only rimfire rifles .22 caliber or smaller or any caliber handgun may be used when hunting hogs with dogs.

TRAPPING: All kill type traps must be at least 50% submerged in water.

OFF-ROAD MOTORIZED VEHICLES/ATVs: Off-road motorized vehicles/ATVs are not allowed.

HORSES: Horseback riding is prohibited during WMA deer and turkey seasons. At all other times horseback riding is restricted to hard surface roads. No hunting from horses.

CAMPING: No camping allowed.

BEARS: Black bears may occur on this WMA. Hunting or disturbing bears is prohibited. Please report any bear sightings on your daily visitor use permit.

CODE OF FEDERAL REGULATIONS, TITLE 36, will be enforced. For additional information, contact the Corps of Engineers at (662) 327-2142.
