The Mississippi Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks, at a meeting in Jackson, Mississippi on April 8, 2010, under authority of Section 25-43-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, made known its intent to adopt the following wildlife management area regulations for the 2010-11 hunting year. This was done under authority of Sections 49-5-13 and 49-7-31, Mississippi Code of 1972.

Be it ordered that Public Notice Number W14 3454 is hereby repealed, and the following 2010-11 wildlife management area hunting regulations are adopted.

**SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR MAHANNAH WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT AREA
PUBLIC NOTICE OF INTENT NUMBER W15 3454(I)**

WMA USER PERMIT: All persons using this wildlife management area, except those exempt from purchasing an annual hunting or fishing license, must carry on their person an annual statewide Wildlife Management Area User Permit. This permit is required in addition to the daily visitor use permit and any required license and may be purchased wherever licenses are sold.

CLOSED AREA: The Waterfowl Sanctuary, enclosed by the East Sanctuary Road on the east, Anderson Tully Road on the south and the main levee on the west, is closed to hunting and scouting.

BAG LIMITS: Same as statewide bag limits except that during permit hunts on deer the legal buck bag limit is one per hunt and for permitted turkey hunts the daily bag limit is one gobbler per permit.

PERMIT STATIONS: All visitors must obtain a DAILY VISITOR USE PERMIT card from a self-service permit station. Parts A and B of this permit must be legibly filled out before using the WMA. Part A of the permit must be deposited in the return box at a permit station before using the WMA. Part B must be displayed on the dash of the vehicle so that the name, address, and date are visible from outside the vehicle. Permits are invalid if not properly dated or if date has been changed. Before leaving the WMA, visitors must complete the reverse side of Part B of the permit and deposit it in the return box at a permit station. It is the responsibility of the Area Manager and other Agency personnel to have permit cards completed.

DEER DATA COLLECTION: All deer harvested must be checked at the WMA headquarters by the hunter who harvested them before leaving the WMA. If WMA personnel are not available to check the deer, the hunter is responsible for collecting and legibly recording ALL biological data. Instructions and equipment will be provided.

DEER HUNTING PERMITS: Deer hunting, except for the youth gun hunt and the January archery hunt, is allowed by special permit only. You may apply online at www.mdwfp.com. Hunters may apply for permitted deer hunts on no more than 3 WMAs statewide during the 2010-11 season. Completed applications must be received by Sep. 1, 2010 to be eligible for drawing. Additionally, hunters who harvest a legal doe during their permitted hunt will be eligible for a drawing for the two Special Gun hunts or for the special Primitive Weapon hunt.

LEGAL BUCKS: Legal bucks are those with an inside spread of at least 16 inches OR one main beam length of at least 20 inches. For hunters less than 16 years of age, one of the three buck bag limit may be any buck.

SPECIAL BUCK TAGS: For research purposes, a limited number of special buck tags which allow the harvest of 1 buck per year with at least one unforked antler will be available for hunters. It is the hunter's responsibility to check on the availability of Special Buck Tags. If available, tags may be acquired at the WMA headquarters or at the self-service deer check station. After harvest of a qualifying buck, hunters must retrieve a tag and attach it to the buck before leaving the WMA. An unforked antler is defined as: a main beam with no other points or broken points.

DOG RESTRICTIONS: Deer hunting with dogs is prohibited. Small game hunting with dogs is allowed during any small game season. Hog hunting with dogs is allowed during daylight hours from Feb. 1 - Feb. 28 only.

TURKEY HUNTING PERMITS: Turkey hunting from Mar. 12-May 1 is allowed by special permit only. You may apply online at www.mdwfp.com. Only one application will be accepted per hunter for the Mahannah WMA permitted turkey hunt. Hunters may apply for permitted turkey hunts on no more than 3 WMAs statewide during the Spring 2011 season. Completed applications must be received by Feb. 15, 2011 to be eligible for drawing.

LEGAL WEAPONS: Only centerfire rifles, shotguns with slugs, primitive weapons, and centerfire handguns may be used for deer hunting. Only rimfire rifles .22 caliber or smaller or any caliber handgun may be used when hunting hogs with dogs.

WATERFOWL: Shooting hours end at 12:00 noon. No boats, blinds, or decoys are to be left out overnight. All waterfowl hunts, except for the waterfowl youth hunts, September teal season, and the post season light goose conservation order, are draw hunts only. You may apply online at www.mdwfp.com. Hunters may apply for permitted waterfowl hunts on no more than 3 WMAs statewide during the 2010-11 season. Completed applications must be received by Nov. 1, 2010 to be eligible for drawing.

WATERFOWL DRAW HUNTING PROCEDURES: Hunt days are Mondays, Wednesdays, Fridays, and Saturdays. Ten reservation positions are allocated for each day before the season starts. Reservations on Monday are for a 1-day hunt and reservations for Friday and Saturday are for a 2-day hunt. Wednesdays are open to standby hunting only. Reservation holders draw numbers first from numbered dowels that represent the number of available hunting positions. After reservation holders draw, dowels are added until there are enough dowels for all standby parties to draw. All hunters then select their positions starting with the lowest number first. Draws will be conducted at 5:00 AM. If reservation holders fail to check in by 5:00am, they risk losing their spot to another hunting party if all hunting positions are filled. A total party of 4 hunters per hunt unit is allowed.

DOVE: No dove hunting shall be allowed prior to the special youth dove hunt on Sep. 11. Youth dove hunters must register at the WMA Headquarters on Sep. 11 between 11:00 am and 1:00 pm. Dove hunting will be allowed daily from Sep. 12 through the end of the first dove season, and on any small game hunting day during the legal dove season after Oct. 1.

OFF-ROAD MOTORIZED VEHICLES/ATVs: Off-road motorized vehicles/ATVs are allowed on designated roads or trails for hunting and fishing access only. Off-road use of ORVs/ATVs is allowed for retrieval of harvested deer or hogs. No loaded weapon may be in possession when retrieving harvested game.

HORSES: Horseback riding is prohibited during WMA deer seasons. At all other times, horseback riding is restricted to roads open to motorized vehicles and designated ATV trails. Raccoon hunting from horses is allowed on entire area during nighttime hunting hours.

CAMPING: Camping is allowed in designated areas only (see map). A WMA Camping Permit is required for any individual or group (maximum of 6 people) that is camping on this WMA and may be purchased wherever licenses are sold. Camping is limited to 14 consecutive days. Camping equipment may not be left unattended for more than 24 hours. All camping equipment and garbage must be removed before final departure.

SCOUTING is allowed daily prior to Oct. 1 and on Saturdays only during permitted deer hunts EXCEPT on Nov. 13 and Nov. 20. Scouting also will be allowed on any small game hunting day. Only those persons drawn to hunt, and waterfowl hunters during waterfowl season, will be allowed on the area during permitted hunts.

BEARS: Black bears may occur on this WMA. They are federally protected as a threatened subspecies. Hunting or disturbing bears is prohibited. Please report any bear sightings on your daily visitor use permit.


