

B. Preceptor

- (1) The Preceptor must hold a Nursing Home Administrator license in Mississippi and have three (3) consecutive years experience in Mississippi as an Administrator or Assistant Administrator in a licensed nursing home facility immediately prior to serving as a Preceptor; must have completed Board-approved training for certification as a preceptor in Mississippi; and currently must be certified as a preceptor by the Board.* For licensed Administrators who have worked under a Temporary Permit, the three years will be calculated beginning the effective date of the temporary permit.

A Nursing Home Administrator will also be considered for preceptor who has direct management responsibility over one or more nursing homes for the three-year period of time set forth above; has completed Board-approved training for certification as a preceptor in Mississippi; and currently is certified as a preceptor by the Board.*

No preceptor certification shall be issued or granted to any person who has had a disciplinary action taken against his or her professional license within the three (3) years prior to date on which his or her eligibility as a preceptor is considered by the Board; who has resigned or surrendered his or her professional license in lieu of disciplinary action or while under investigation or while disciplinary action is pending. The Board may also refuse to grant a preceptor certification to an individual who has a pending or unresolved complaint or investigation against his or her license; who has disciplinary action, sanctions, order, or agreement in effect against his or her professional license; and/or whose license is in any way restricted or otherwise subject to disciplinary action.

*Note: Preceptor Certification training is offered annually by the Board for nursing home administrators eligible to serve as preceptors in Mississippi. Preceptor certification is for a period of two (2) years and is renewable biannually, as long as other criteria are met.

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
