1. Describe the need for the proposed action. Residents in personal care homes, both residential and assisted living, do not receive educational information on Influenza disease at this time.
2. Describe the benefits which will likely accrue as the result of the proposed action: Residents in personal care homes, both residential and assisted living, will receive educational information on Influenza disease.
3. Describe the effect the proposed action will have on the public health, safety, and welfare: It will provide information on influenza disease to residents in personal care homes, both residential and assisted living,

The new rule does not require facilities to provide or pay for any vaccination against influenza.

5. Estimate the cost or economic benefit to all persons directly affected by the proposed action: We cannot identify with certainty the exact cost to residents; the rule does not require facilities to provide or pay for any vaccination against influenza.
