2013 ELECTIONS CALENDAR

This calendar is for planning purposes only. Dates are subject to change or revision. Please refer to the proper citation to the Mississippi Code Annotated (Miss. Code Ann. (1972)), the Mississippi Constitution, Secretary of State Regulations, federal law, and other cited sources for more complete legal requirements of the calendar entries printed below. Contact the Secretary of State's Office for updates or further information.

JANUARY

- 10th** Campaign Finance Report at 5 p.m.: Periodic report (October 1, 2012 through December 31, 2012) due for judicial candidates and judicial committees only. (*Miss. Code Ann. § 23-15-807(b)(ii)*)
- 30th** Lobbying: 2012 Annual Reports due at 5 p.m.: Lobbyist's Annual Report (FORM A) and Lobbyist's Client Annual Report (FORM C) (Fines begin Saturday, February 9, 2013)
- 31st** Campaign Finance Report at 5 p.m.: Annual report (January 1, 2012 through December 31, 2012) due for all candidates and all political committees that made political expenditures in Mississippi during the 2012 election period. (*Miss. Code Ann. § 23-15-807*)

FEBRUARY

- 25th** Lobbying: 2013 Mid-Session Reports due at 5 p.m.: Legislative Session Report (FORM E) (Fines begin Thursday, March 7, 2013).

MARCH

- 8th** Qualifying Deadline at 5 p.m.: Deadline to file qualifying fee and statement of intent (or petition, if qualifying as an independent candidate) with the Municipal Clerk. (*Miss. Code Ann. §§ 23-15-309(1) and 23-15-361(1)*)
- 22nd** Statement of Economic Interest: File with Mississippi Ethics Commission (*Miss. Code Ann. § 25-4-29*) Non-incumbents must file within 15 days after qualifying.
- 23rd** Absentee ballots: Municipalities which conduct party primaries have absentee ballots for the primary available on and after March 23rd. Absentee ballots for the general election in such municipalities must be prepared as soon as possible after party nominees are determined, but not before May 7th. (*Miss. Code Ann. § 23-15-715(a)*)

APRIL

- 1st** Voter Registration: Municipal Clerk's offices may remain open from 8 a.m. until 7 p.m. every day from April 1st until April 5th for voter registration. (*Miss. Code Ann. § 23-15-37(2)*)
- 6th** Voter Registration: Municipal Clerk's offices shall remain open from 8 a.m. until 12 p.m. for voter registration.
- 6th** Voter Registration Deadline for Primary Election at 12:00 p.m. (*Miss. Code Ann. § 23-15-37*)
- 17th** Lobbying: 2013 End-of-Session Reports Due at 5 p.m.: (Sine Die April 7, 2013) Legislative Session Report (FORM E) (Fines begin Saturday, April 27, 2013)
- 22nd** Absentee ballots: Municipalities which do not conduct party primaries have absentee ballots for the general election prepared and available on and after April 22nd, if the municipal clerk's office is normally not open on Saturdays. If the clerk's office is normally open on Saturdays, then absentee ballots for the general election are prepared and available on and after April 20th. (*Miss. Code Ann. § 23-15-715(a)*)
- 27th** Voting by Absentee Ballot: Municipal Clerk's office open from 8 a.m. until 12 p.m. for absentee voting if a primary election is being held. (*Miss. Code Ann. § 23-15-653*)

- 29th** Voter Registration: Municipal Clerk's offices may remain open from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. every day from April 29th until May 3rd for voter registration. (*Miss. Code Ann. § 23-15-37(2)*)
- 30th** Campaign Finance Report: Pre-Primary election campaign finance report due at Municipal Clerk's office. (*Miss. Code Ann. §§ 23-15-805 and 23-15-807(b)(i)*)

MAY

- 1st** Statement of Economic Interest: Deadline for incumbents to file with the Mississippi Ethics Commission. (*Miss. Code Ann. § 25-4-29(a)*)
- 4th** Deadline for Voting by Absentee Ballot in Person for Primary Election: Municipal Clerk's office open from 8 a.m. until 12 p.m. (*Miss. Code Ann. §§ 23-15-653*)
- 4th** Voter Registration Deadline for General Election: Municipal Clerk's offices shall remain open from 8 a.m. until 12 p.m. for voter registration. (*Miss. Code Ann. § 23-15-37*)
- 6th** Deadline for Receipt of Absentee Ballots by Mail at 5 p.m.: Deadline for receipt of mailed absentee ballots by the Municipal Clerk in order to be counted for Primary Election. (*Miss. Code Ann. §§ 23-15-631(c)*)
- 7th** **PRIMARY ELECTION**: Municipal Office(s) (*Miss. Code Ann. § 23-15-171*)
- 11th** Voting by Absentee Ballot: Municipal Clerk's office open from 8 a.m. until 12 p.m. for absentee voting if a runoff primary election is being held. (*Miss. Code Ann. § 23-15-653*)
- 14th** Campaign Finance Report: Pre-runoff election reports due. (*Miss. Code Ann. §§ 23-15-805 and 23-15-807(b)(i)*); Runoff candidates only.
- 18th** Deadline for Voting by Absentee Ballot in Person for Runoff Primary Election: Deadline for casting absentee ballots for second primary election in Municipal Clerk's office. Municipal Clerk's office open until noon, if a runoff primary election is being held. (*Miss. Code Ann. §§ 23-15-715 and 23-15-653*)
- 20th** Deadline for Receipt of Absentee Ballots by Mail at 5 p.m.: Deadline for receipt of mailed absentee ballots by the Municipal Clerk in order to be counted for runoff (second) primary election. (*Miss. Code Ann. § 23-15-631*)

- 21st PRIMARY RUNOFF ELECTION:** Municipal Office(s)
(*Miss. Code Ann. § 23-15-171*)
- 25th Voting by Absentee Ballot:** Municipal Clerk's office open from 8 a.m. until 12 p.m. for absentee voting for General Election. (*Miss. Code Ann. § 23-15-653*)
- 28th Campaign Finance Report:** Pre-General Election Campaign finance report due.
(*Miss. Code Ann. §§ 23-15-805 and 23-15-807*)

JUNE

- 1st Deadline for Voting by Absentee Ballot in Person for General Election:** Deadline for casting absentee ballots for general election in Municipal Clerk's office. Municipal Clerk's office open from 8 a.m. until 12 p.m. (*Miss. Code Ann. §§ 23-15-715, 23-15-631*)
- 3rd Deadline for Receipt of Absentee Ballots by Mail at 5 p.m.:** Deadline for receipt of mailed absentee ballots by the Municipal Clerk in order to be counted for general election. (*Miss. Code Ann. § 23-15-631(c)*)
- 4th MUNICIPAL GENERAL ELECTION** (*Miss. Code Ann. § 23-15-173*)

JULY

- 1st** Municipal officer's terms begin. (*Miss. Code Ann. §§ 21-15-1 and 21-15-39*)

AUGUST

- 7th Qualifying Period:** First day of qualifying for Consolidated/Consolidated Line School District Trustees and Special Municipal Separate School District Trustee (Louisville, Grenada, Natchez-Adams, Tishomingo County and Vicksburg-Warren County). (*Miss. Code Ann. §§ 37-7-225, 37-7-711*)

SEPTEMBER

- 6th Qualifying Deadline:** Consolidated/Consolidated Line School District Trustee, Municipal Separate School District Trustee, Vicksburg-Warren County Special Municipal Separate School District Trustee and Regular Special Election Candidates (*Miss. Code Ann. §§ 37-7-211, 37-7-225, 37-7-711 and 23-15-833*)

OCTOBER

- 4th** Qualifying Deadline: Special Municipal Separate School District Trustee (Louisville, Grenada, Natchez-Adams, Tishomingo County only). (Miss. Code Ann. § 37-7-711)

NOVEMBER

- 5th** **ELECTION DAY:** Regular Special Elections to fill vacancies; Municipal Separate School District Trustee; Consolidated/ Consolidated Line School District Trustee; Special Municipal Separate School District Trustee (Miss. Code Ann. §§ 23-15-833, 37-7-215, 37-7-223)
- 26th** **Runoff Election Day (if necessary):** Special Elections; Consolidated/ Consolidated Line School District Trustee (Miss. Code Ann. §§ 23-15-833, 37-7-215, 37-7-227)

JANUARY 2014

- 30th** Lobbying: 2013 Annual Reports Due at 5 p.m.: Lobbyist's Annual Report (FORM A) Lobbyist's Client Annual Report (FORM C) (Fines begin Sunday, February 9, 2014)
