Chapter 11 Retail Pickup from Native Distilleries and Native Wineries

- 100 Miss. Code Ann. Section 67-1-41(10) allows retail permittees to pick up native wines and spirits sold by the Department, so that those alcoholic beverages may be delivered to the retail permittee at the native winery or native distillery instead of via shipment from the Department's warehouse. All orders for such products must be placed through the LDC Warehouse utilizing TAP.
- 101 Retail permittees may pick up alcoholic beverages directly from a native distillery or native winery after first notifying the LDC Warehouse. Such alcoholic beverages must be listed by the LDC Warehouse to be eligible for direct pick up.
- 102 Retail permittees shall notify the LDC Warehouse via electronic mail at retail.pickup@dor.ms.gov, prior to the order being picked up, that it intends on picking up these products from the native distillery or native winery.
- 103 Retail permittees shall abide by all restrictions on transporting alcoholic beverages, including but not limited to those as stated under Miss. Code Ann. Section 27-71-15 (Means of Transportation).

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Chapter 11 Retail Pickup from Native Distilleries and Native Wineries

- 100 Miss. Code [Ann.](#) Section 67-1-41(10) allows retail permittees to pick up native wines and spirits sold by the Department, so that those alcoholic beverages may be delivered to the retail ~~permittee at the native winery or native distillery instead of via shipment from the Department's warehouse.~~ warehouse. The native winery or distillery shall be accepting the order on behalf of the Department and shall collect and remit all applicable taxes and markups to the Department as if the product had been ordered and delivered through the LDC Warehouse. All orders for such products must be placed through the LDC Warehouse utilizing TAP.
- 101 Retail permittees may pick up alcoholic beverages directly from a native distillery or native winery after first notifying the LDC Warehouse ~~that it will be ordering product from the distillery or native winery.~~ Such alcoholic beverages must be listed by the LDC Warehouse to be eligible for direct pick up.
- 102~~3~~ Retail permittees shall notify the LDC Warehouse via ~~Electronic Mail~~ electronic mail at retail.pickup@dor.ms.gov, prior to the order being ~~picked up, placed with the distillery or native winery~~ that it intends on picking up these products from the native distillery or native winery.
- 104 ~~The native winery or distillery shall provide the retailer with an invoice itemizing the number of bottles and price of each bottle sold to the retailer. The retailer shall maintain this invoice for three (3) years. On months in which the native winery or distillery sells wine to retailers for pickup after providing notice to the LDC Warehouse, the native winery or distillery shall file a monthly report through TAP itemizing the number of bottles sold and price of each bottle sold to retailers under this regulation. A copy of all invoices showing such sales will be attached to the TAP filing. The native winery or distillery will not be required to file a monthly report if no such sales are made during that month.~~
