- Describe the need for the proposed action: The proposed rule is being filed to correspond with MS SPA 24-0015 (effective October 1, 2024).
- Describe the benefits which will likely accrue as the result of the proposed action: This regulation informs the
 public of the allowance for adults to receive above the monthly prescription limit when prior authorized as medically necessary and to allow for
 coverage of prescription drugs that are not covered outpatient drugs when medically necessary during drug shortages identified by the Food and Drug
 Administration (FDA).
- Describe the effect the proposed action will have on the public health, safety, and welfare: The proposed
 action will have a positive effect on public health due to medically necessary prescription allowances above the monthly limit for adults and coverage
 of prescription drugs that are not covered outpatient drugs when medically necessary during drug shortages identified by the Food and Drug
 Administration (FDA).
- 4. Estimate the cost to the agency and to any other state or local government entities, of implementing and enforcing the proposed action, including the estimated amount of paperwork, and any anticipated effect on state or local revenues: The estimated annual impact is \$750,060.

Provide a detailed statement of the data and methodology used in making estimates required by this subsection: It was estimated that two percent of the total Fee-for-Service (FFS) population may fill greater than six (6) prescriptions per month. The June 2024 FFS population totaled 231,652 beneficiaries. Two percent of the June 2024 FFS population equals 463 unique beneficiaries. Using an average prescription cost of \$135 the annual impact is \$750,060.
