WHEREAS, through a series of letter agreements between the United States Military and the Mississippi Office of the Governor, the United States assumed exclusive federal jurisdiction over a number of parcels of real property comprising the Keesler Air Force Base located in the City of Biloxi, Harrison County, Mississippi; and

WHEREAS, by letter dated May 15, 2024, the Department of the Air Force, acting as the lead branch of the United States Military for the State of Mississippi, pursuant to federal authority, including 10 U.S.C. § 2683, requested the State of Mississippi's support to begin the discussion of establishing concurrent jurisdiction over the real property comprising the Keesler Air Force Base; and

WHEREAS, by letter received on September 19, 2024, the Undersecretary of the United States Air Force offered cessation of lands under the exclusive jurisdiction of the United States and in return would accept the portions of land under the proprietary jurisdiction of the State of Mississippi in order to meet the Air Force's stated goal of concurrent jurisdiction on all lands comprising the Keesler Air Force Base; and

WHEREAS, by letter dated June 22, 2020, the United States Attorney for the Southern District of Mississippi concurred in the proposal to establish concurrent jurisdiction over the real property comprising the Keesler Air Force Base; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution Number 509-20, unanimously adopted by the Biloxi City Council on August 25, 2020, the Council requested Governor Tate Reeves allow for the establishment of concurrent jurisdiction over the entire boundary of Keesler Air Force Base including three off-base areas (Thrower Park, East Falcon and West Falcon) and the Family Camping area; and

WHEREAS, by letter dated September 24, 2020, the United States Department of Justice, Office of the Enforcement Operations, concurred in the Air Force's assessment that the adjustment to concurrent jurisdiction over the entirety of Keesler Air Force Base, including the off-base housing areas and campground, is desirable; and

WHEREAS, by accepting concurrent jurisdiction over the parcels that comprise Keesler Air Force Base, it is believed that both state and federal civil and criminal statutes can be more effectively enforced, and, furthermore, that the person and properties of residents of the State of Mississippi and of the United States can be better protected through the joint and cooperative efforts of state and federal law enforcement agencies.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tate Reeves, Governor of the State of Mississippi, in the name and by the authority of the STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, including Article 5, § 116 of the Mississippi Constitution, and Mississippi Code §§ 7-1-5(a), 7-1-7 and 3-5-5, do hereby consent to entering into concurrent jurisdiction with the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA and cede the existing proprietary jurisdiction over the parcels that comprise Keesler Air Force Base. The concurrent jurisdiction accepted hereby shall continue for so long as the United States of America shall own the lands, or any portion thereof, for the purpose of operating and maintaining on such property a military installation or for similar purposes.

WHEREAS, through a series of letter agreements between the United States Military and the Mississippi Office of the Governor, the United States assumed exclusive federal jurisdiction over a number of parcels of real property comprising the Keesler Air Force Base located in the City of Biloxi, Harrison County, Mississippi; and

WHEREAS, by letter dated May 15, 2024, the Department of the Air Force, acting as the lead branch of the United States Military for the State of Mississippi, pursuant to federal authority, including 10 U.S.C. § 2683, requested the State of Mississippi's support to begin the discussion of establishing concurrent jurisdiction over the real property comprising the Keesler Air Force Base, attached hereto as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, by letter received on September 19, 2024, the Undersecretary of the United States Air Force offered cessation of lands under the exclusive jurisdiction of the United States and in return would accept the portions of land under the proprietary jurisdiction of the State of Mississippi in order to meet the Air Force's stated goal of concurrent jurisdiction on all lands comprising the Keesler Air Force Base, attached hereto as Exhibit B; and

WHEREAS, by letter dated June 22, 2020, the United States Attorney for the Southern District of Mississippi concurred in the proposal to establish concurrent jurisdiction over the real property comprising the Keesler Air Force Base and directed his staff to assist in this process, attached hereto as Exhibit C; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution Number 509-20, unanimously adopted by the Biloxi City Council on August 25, 2020, the City Council requested Governor Tate Reeves allow for the

establishment of concurrent jurisdiction over the entire boundary of Keesler Air Force Base including three off-base areas (Thrower Park, East Falcon and West Falcon) and the Family Camping area, attached hereto as Exhibit D; and

WHEREAS, by letter dated September 24, 2020, the United States Department of Justice, Office of the Enforcement Operations, concurred in the Air Force's assessment that the adjustment to concurrent jurisdiction over the entirety of Keesler Air Force Base, including the off-base housing areas and campground, is desirable, attached hereto as Exhibit E; and

WHEREAS, a boundary survey of the eleven parcels that comprise Keesler Air Force Base, specifically "Main Base", "Bay Ridge", "Oak Park", "East/West Falcon Park", "Harrison Court", "Shadow Lawn", "Annex 1", "Thrower Park", "Maltby Hall", Tract K-1 (Adjoining Falcon Park)" and Tract K-2 (Adjoining Bay Ridge)", has been conducted and is attached hereto as Exhibit F; and

WHEREAS, by Executive Order Number 1583, Governor Tate Reeves, on behalf of the State of Mississippi, consented to entering into concurrent jurisdiction with the United States of America and ceded the existing proprietary jurisdiction over the eleven above-described parcels that comprise Keesler Air Force Base in Harrison County, Mississippi, attached hereto as Exhibit G; and

WHEREAS, by accepting concurrent jurisdiction over the eleven above-described parcels that comprise Keesler Air Force Base in Harrison County, Mississippi, it is believed that both state and federal civil and criminal statutes can be more effectively enforced, and, furthermore, that the person and properties of residents of the State of Mississippi and of the United States can be better protected through the joint and cooperative efforts of state and federal law enforcement agencies.


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tate Reeves, Governor of the State of Mississippi, in the name and by the authority of the STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, including the Tenth Amendment to the United States Constitution, Article 5, § 116 of the Mississippi Constitution, and Mississippi Code §§ 7-1-5(a), 7-1-7 and 3-5-5, do hereby consent to entering into concurrent jurisdiction with the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA and cede the existing proprietary jurisdiction over the eleven parcels of land described in Exhibit F hereto which comprise Keesler Air Force Base.

The UNITED STATES OF AMERICA and the STATE OF MISSISSIPPI shall concurrently have full civil and criminal jurisdiction over the eleven parcels of land described in Exhibit F hereto which comprise Keesler Air Force Base. The concurrent jurisdiction accepted hereby shall continue for so long as the United States of America shall own the lands described in Exhibit F, or any portion thereof, for the purpose of operating and maintaining on such property a military installation or for similar purposes.





Governor Reeves:

The Conference Report to the Fiscal Year 2019 National Defense Authorization Act, coupled with new Department of Defense (DoD) policy, requires the Secretaries of the Military Departments to seek to establish concurrent criminal jurisdiction with host states for both juvenile and civilian adult crimes on military installations with exclusive federal jurisdiction.

For juvenile cases, the establishment of concurrent jurisdiction is expected to facilitate the referral and adjudication of these offenses in the Mississippi court system. Although juvenile offenses occurring on installations with exclusive federal jurisdiction are often referred to the applicable U.S. Attorney's Office, the federal government does not have the established infrastructure, procedures, or resources to adjudicate juvenile offenders appropriately or ensure proper rehabilitative steps are pursued. For adult civilian offenses, concurrent criminal jurisdiction ensures an adequate venue for criminal prosecution exists in a specific case in the event federal jurisdiction is otherwise in question. Concurrent criminal jurisdiction also provides for the possibility of prosecuting serious crimes occurring on the installation in state courts as felonies if prosecuting such crimes as felonies in federal courts is not possible.

To be efficient, each Service was apportioned a number of states to serve as the lead Service, and the Air Force is the lead for Mississippi. I am respectfully requesting your support to begin the discussion of establishing concurrent jurisdiction where appropriate. Specifically, we would ask for a point of contact to further discuss the DOD's desire to establish concurrent jurisdiction for civilian crimes occurring on military installations within Mississippi.

The Service point of contact for this effort is Major Dean Korsak, 228-377-1319, dean.korsak.1@us.af.mil. Major Korsak has already held preliminary discussions with Mr. Chuck McIntosh from your office, Mr. Ethan Samsel, Mississippi Senate staff counsel, and State Senator Dennis Debar. The United States Attorney for the Southern District of Mississippi, D. Michael Hurst, Jr., previously concurred with this request. We have copied the Mississippi Attorney General in this request. I thank you for your consideration of our request and for your continued support to the Department of Defense and the Department of the Air Force.


Dear Lt. Col. Padalino:

I have reviewed your letter regarding the Keesler Air Force Base (KAFB) proposal to request that jurisdiction for the entire boundary of KAFB property including three off-base housing areas (Thrower Park, East Falcon, and West Falcon) and the Family Camping (Fam Camp) area to be changed to concurrent federal and state jurisdiction. I understand that this action will include retroceding most areas from exclusive federal jurisdiction to concurrent jurisdiction, and acquiring concurrent jurisdiction for the areas within KAFB boundaries currently operating under proprietary jurisdiction. I understand that these changes are being requested by KAFB to improve patrolling and law enforcement efforts in these areas.

The U.S. Attorney's Office is aware of some of the issues that have resulted from current limitations preventing federal officials from being able to fully work with state and local jurisdictions in areas of mutual interest and, therefore, concurs with your proposal. Our office, along with the Department of the Air Force Headquarters 81st Training Wing at Keesler Air Force Base, is writing to you requesting a change of legislative jurisdiction at Keesler Air Force Base. This change of legislative jurisdiction at Keesler Air Force Base would allow the entire base proper and off-base housing areas of East Falcon, West Falcon, Thrower Park, and the Family Camping Area to sit in concurrent jurisdiction with the Biloxi Police Department.

We currently have a mix of exclusive federal and proprietary jurisdiction, which create inefficiencies for law enforcement and hinders their ability to respond to incidents. Uniformity will alleviate these issues and can be achieved by establishing concurrent jurisdiction throughout Keesler Air Force Base proper and the housing and camping areas mentioned above.

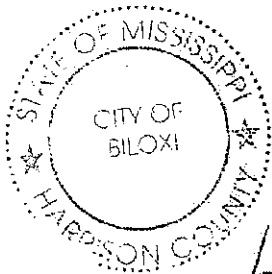

RESOLUTION REQUESTING GOVERNOR TATE REEVES TO ALLOW A CHANGE OF LEGISLATIVE JURISDICTION FOR THE ENTIRE BOUNDARY OF KEESLER AIR FORCE BASE INCLUDING THREE OFF BASE AREAS (THROWER PARK, EAST FALCON, AND WEST FALCON) AND THE FAMILY CAMPING AREA TO CHANGE TO CONCURRENT FEDERAL AND STATE JURISDICTION

WHEREAS, the Department of the Air Force Headquarters 81st Training Wing (AETC) at Keesler Air Force Base, Mississippi has requested that state and local authorities authorize a change of Legislative Jurisdiction at Keesler Air Force Base to allow change of legislative jurisdiction for the entire boundary of Keesler Air Force Base including three off base areas (Thrower Park, East Falcon, and West Falcon) and the Family Camping area to concurrent federal and state jurisdiction which would allow the Biloxi Police Department to acquire concurrent jurisdiction with the 81st Security Forces Squadron; and

WHEREAS, these changes are requested to improve patrolling and law enforcement efforts in these areas, including avoidance of ongoing jurisdictional conflicts; and

WHEREAS, the US Attorney's office has concurred with this proposal, as set forth in Exhibit "A"; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Air Force Headquarters 81st Training Wing (AETC) at Keesler Air Force Base has requested the city's approval by this Resolution and having the Mayor sign the letter attached as Exhibit "B".

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BILOXI, MISSISSIPPI, THAT:

Section 1: The findings, conclusions, and statements of fact contained in the foregoing preamble are hereby adopted, ratified, and incorporated herein.

Section 2: It is requested Governor Tate Reeves allow the Department of the Air Force Headquarters 81st Training Wing (AETC) at Keesler Air Force Base, Mississippi, the City of Biloxi and the Biloxi Police Department be able to move forward with a change of Legislative Jurisdiction at Keesler Air Force Base to allow change of legislative jurisdiction for the entire boundary of Keesler Air Force Base including three off base areas (Thrower Park, East Falcon, and West Falcon) and the Family Camping area to concurrent jurisdiction between the Biloxi Police Department and the 81st Security Forces Squadron.

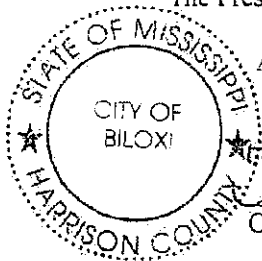

Dear Lt. Colonel Padalino:

We have considered the proposal of the Department of the Air Force to adjust the jurisdiction over Keesler Air Force Base (KAFB) to concurrent jurisdiction. The request pertains to the entire boundary of the main KAFB, three off-base housing areas (Thrower Park, East Falcon, West Falcon), the Family Camp campground, and the Bayridge Housing area.


Currently, the main KAFB and the East and West Falcon Off-Base Housing Areas are under exclusive jurisdiction. The Thrower Park and Bayridge Housing Areas, and Family Camp, are under a combination of exclusive and proprietary jurisdiction, depending on the precise location.

Adjusting the jurisdiction over all of the KAFB to concurrent jurisdiction will allow emergencies and violations of criminal law by the base's many civilian employees, residents, and juveniles to be addressed more efficiently and effectively by the most appropriate law enforcement authority. We understand that upon receiving this concurrence with the Air Force's proposal, the Air Force will coordinate with the Air Force Civil Engineering Center and the Governor of Mississippi to effectuate the alterations of jurisdiction.

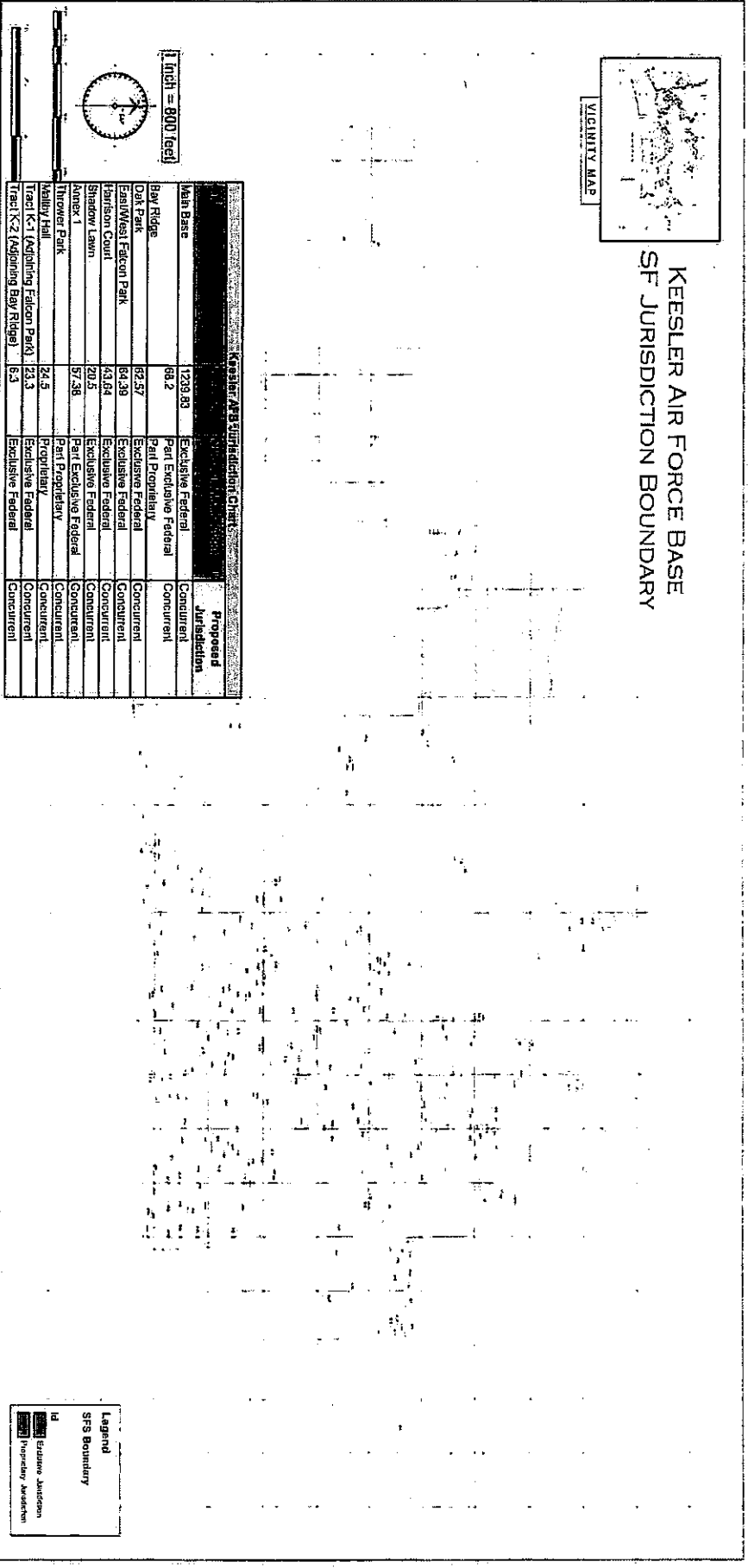

KEESLER AIR FORCE BASE SF JURISDICTION BOUNDARY

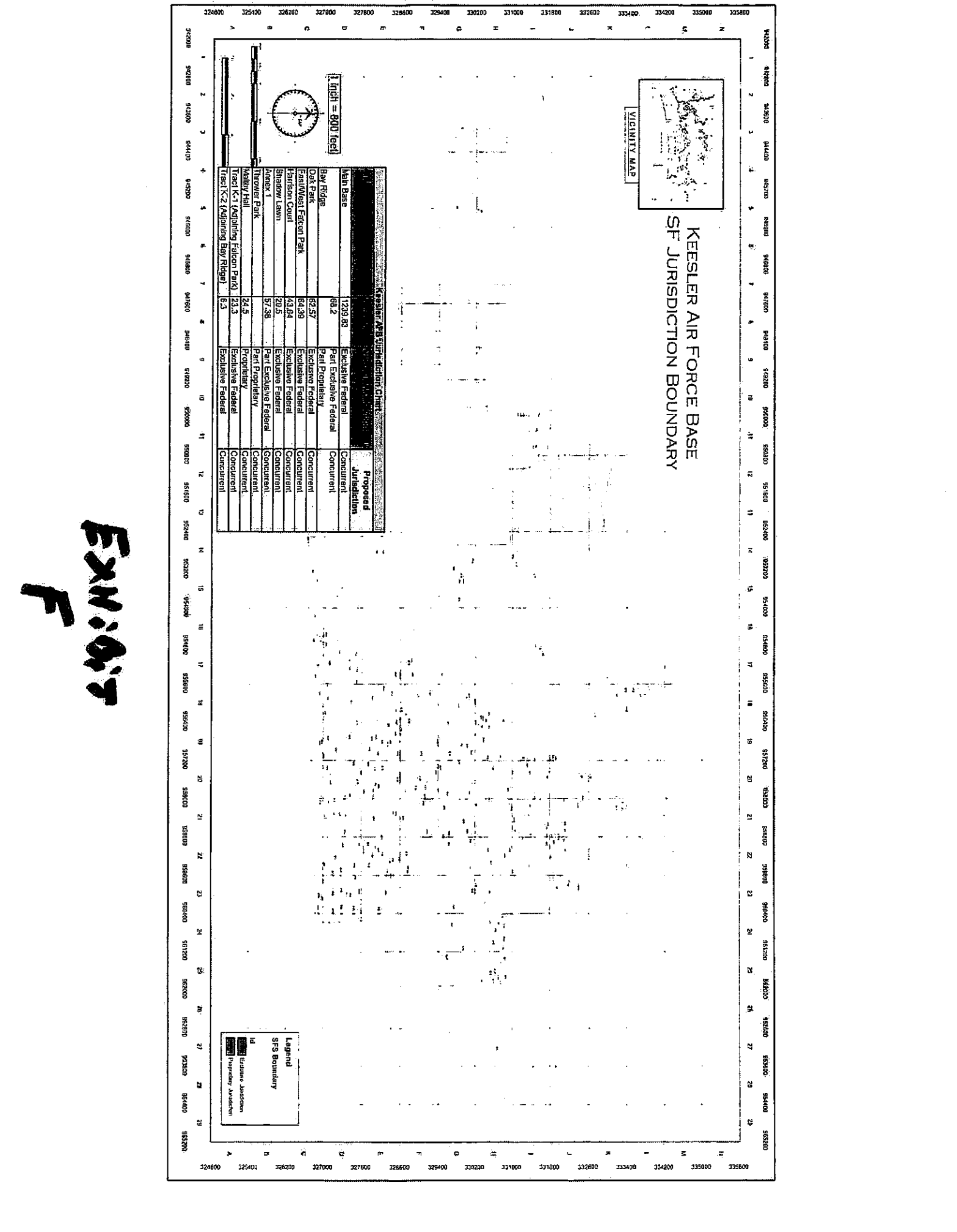

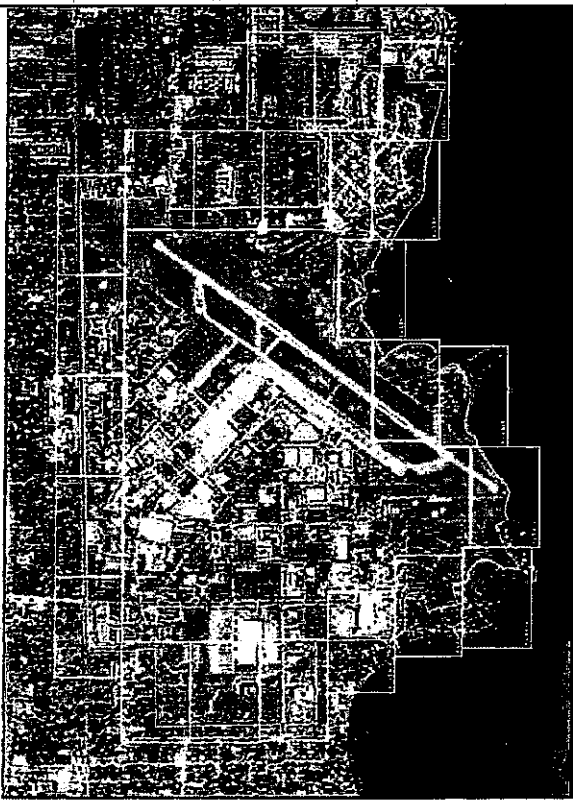
VICINITY MAP

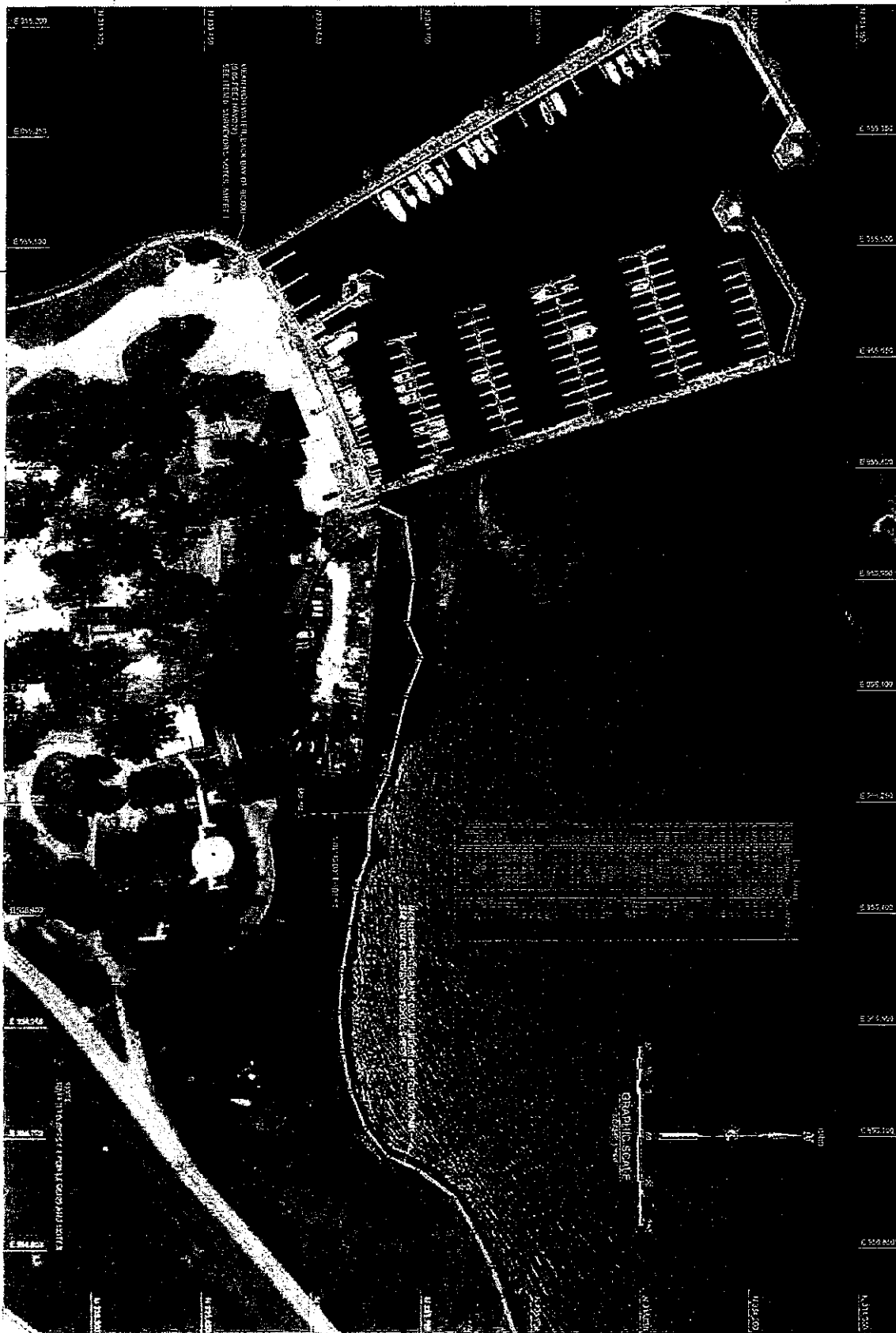

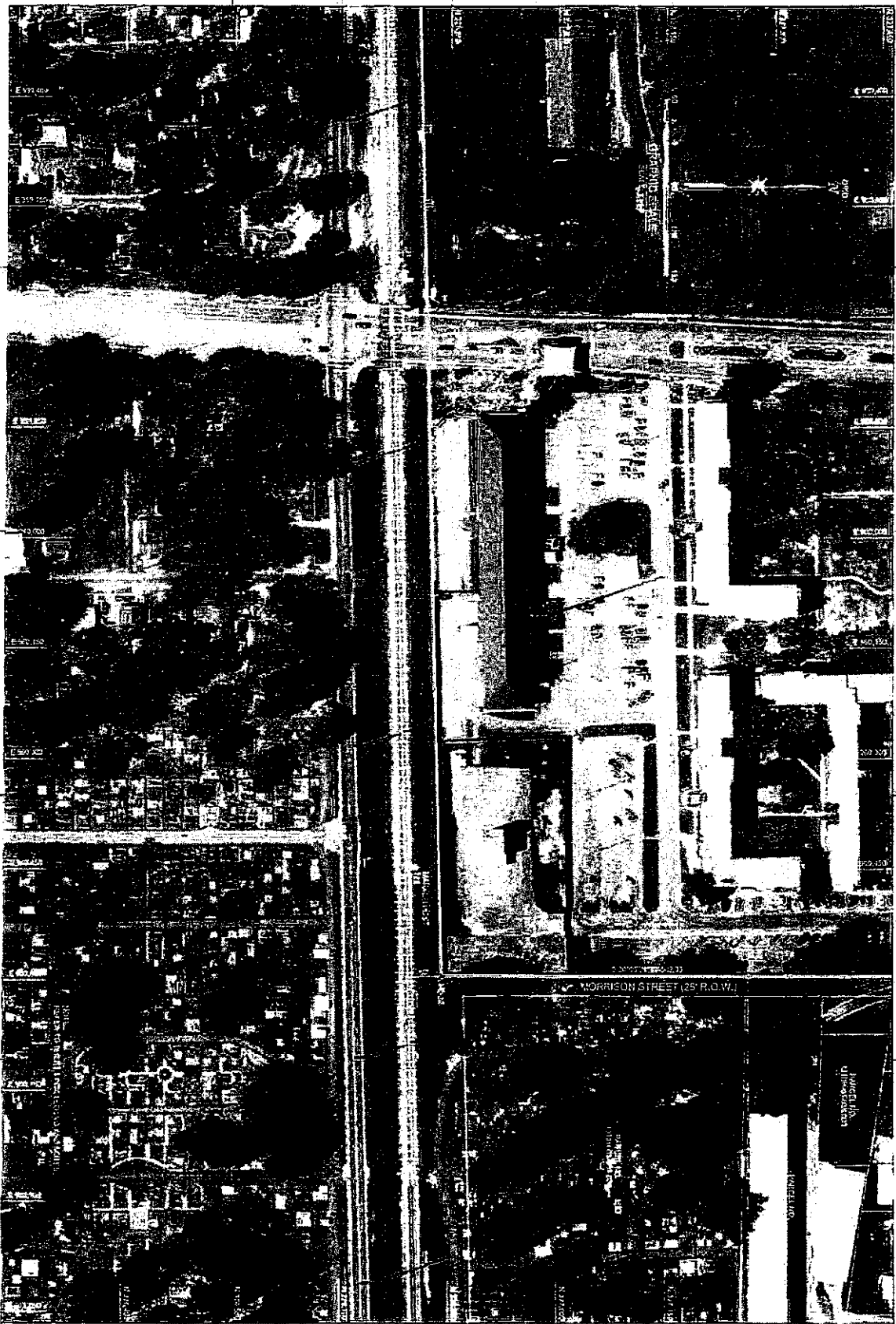

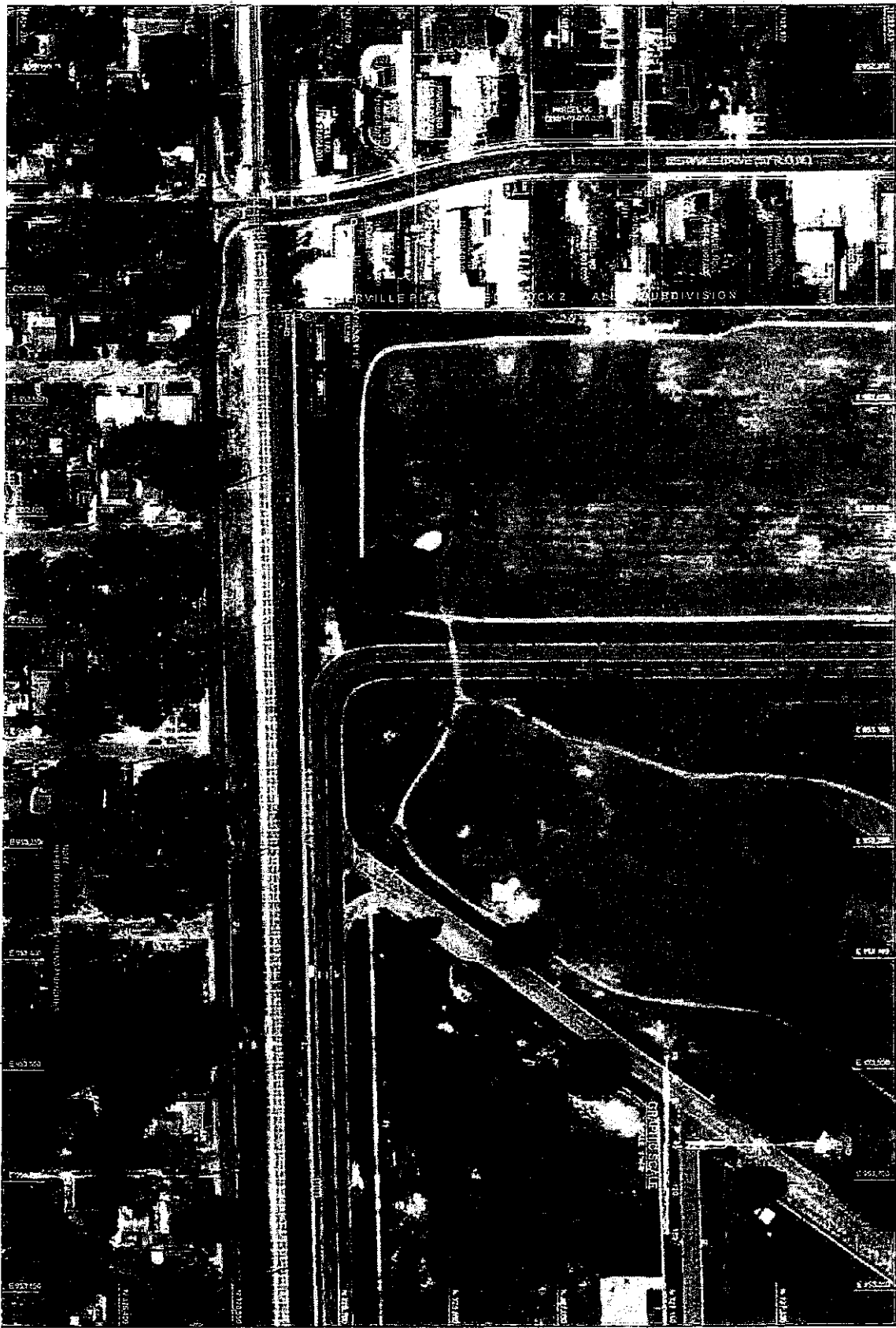

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 1583

WHEREAS, through a series of letter agreements between the United States Military and the Mississippi Office of the Governor, the United States assumed exclusive federal jurisdiction over a number of parcels of real property comprising the Keesler Air Force Base located in the City of Biloxi, Harrison County, Mississippi; and

WHEREAS, by letter dated May 15, 2024, the Department of the Air Force, acting as the lead branch of the United States Military for the State of Mississippi, pursuant to federal authority, including 10 U.S.C. § 2683, requested the State of Mississippi's support to begin the discussion of establishing concurrent jurisdiction over the real property comprising the Keesler Air Force Base; and

WHEREAS, by letter received on September 19, 2024, the Undersecretary of the United States Air Force offered cessation of lands under the exclusive jurisdiction of the United States and in return would accept the portions of land under the proprietary jurisdiction of the State of Mississippi in order to meet the Air Force's stated goal of concurrent jurisdiction on all lands comprising the Keesler Air Force Base; and

WHEREAS, by letter dated June 22, 2020, the United States Attorney for the Southern District of Mississippi concurred in the proposal to establish concurrent jurisdiction over the real property comprising the Keesler Air Force Base; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution Number 509-20, unanimously adopted by the Biloxi City Council on August 25, 2020, the Council requested Governor Tate Reeves allow for the establishment of concurrent jurisdiction over the entire boundary of Keesler Air Force Base including three off-base areas (Thrower Park, East Falcon and West Falcon) and the Family Camping area; and

WHEREAS, by letter dated September 24, 2020, the United States Department of Justice, Office of the Enforcement Operations, concurred in the Air Force's assessment that the adjustment to concurrent jurisdiction over the entirety of Keesler Air Force Base, including the off-base housing areas and campground, is desirable; and

WHEREAS, by accepting concurrent jurisdiction over the parcels that comprise Keesler Air Force Base, it is believed that both state and federal civil and criminal statutes can be more effectively enforced, and, furthermore, that the person and properties of residents of the State of Mississippi and of the United States can be better protected through the joint and cooperative efforts of state and federal law enforcement agencies.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tate Reeves, Governor of the State of Mississippi, in the name and by the authority of the STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, including Article 5, § 116 of the Mississippi Constitution, and Mississippi Code §§ 7-1-5(a), 7-1-7 and 3-5-5, do hereby consent to entering into concurrent jurisdiction with the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA and cede the existing proprietary jurisdiction over the parcels that comprise Keesler Air Force Base. The concurrent jurisdiction accepted hereby shall continue for so long as the United States of America shall own the lands, or any portion thereof, for the purpose of operating and maintaining on such property a military installation or for similar purposes.



IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Mississippi to be affixed.
