January

Qualifying Period Begins: First day candidates may submit petitions to be placed on the presidential preference primary election ballot. Petitions must be filed with the state executive committee of the appropriate political party. (*MS Code Ann. § 23-15-1093*)

Qualifying Period Begins: First day candidates may qualify for U. S. Congress, Supreme Court and Court of Appeals, County Election Commissioner, Yazoo-Mississippi Delta Levee Commissioner and Mississippi Levee Commissioner. (*MS Code Ann. §§ 23-15-299, 23-15-359, 23-15-977, Gen. Laws of 1928, Ch. 12*)

- 5th <u>Legislative session begins</u>. (MS Const. 1890 §36, MS Code Ann. § 5-1-7)

Qualifying Deadline, 5:00 p.m.: Party primary and independent candidates for U. S. Congress and Yazoo-Mississippi Delta Levee Commissioner. State Executive Committees transmit copies of all qualifying papers to MSOS by 6:00 p.m. (*MS Code Ann. §§ 23-15-299, 23-15-359, Gen. Laws of 1928, Ch. 12*)

Campaign Finance Deadline, 5:00 p.m.: Periodic Campaign Finance Reports for all 2015 candidates due in the appropriate office. (*MS Code Ann. § 23-15-807(b)(ii) & (e)*)

12th <u>Voter Roll Maintenance</u>: County Election Commissioners meet to conduct voter roll maintenance and purge ineligible voters from SEMS. (*MS Code Ann. § 23-15-153(1)(a)*)

NOTE: This date is within 90 days of a federal election - no systematic purging may occur at this time. However, voters MAY continue to be purged from the voter roll based upon death, conviction of disenfranchising crimes, adjudication of incompetence and voluntary requests for removal signed by the voters.

- 9th <u>Late Absentee Ballots</u>: The applications and unopened absentee ballot envelopes received after the applicable deadline(s) must be stamped with the day and hour of receipt and retained for the period of time required for the preservation of ballots. (MS Code Ann. § 23-15-647)
- 16th <u>Voter ID Affidavit Ballot Deadline, 5:00 p.m.</u>: Last day affidavit voters who cast an affidavit ballot by reason of voter ID may present an acceptable form of photo ID or complete an affidavit of religious objection in the Circuit Clerk's office. (*MS Const. 1890 § 249-A*)
- 18th Delivery of Returns Deadline: County Election Commission(s) must transmit to the Secretary of State their counties' General Election returns, including certified recap sheets and statement of the whole number of votes given in the county for each candidate. The certification of the election must be signed and dated by a majority of the county election commissioners. (MS Code Ann. § 23-15-603) No candidate shall be certified as elected unless all required campaign finance reports have been filed. (MS Code Ann. § 23-15-811)

Publication of Notice of Runoff Poll Worker Training: Public notice of the time and location of poll manager training must be posted at the courthouse and published in a newspaper five (5) days before the date of the training. (*MS Code Ann. § 23-15-239(1)(4)*)

- **30**th Late Runoff Absentee Ballots: The applications and unopened absentee ballot envelopes received after the applicable deadline(s) must be stamped with the day and hour of receipt and retained for the period of time required for the preservation of ballots. (MS Code Ann. § 23-15-647)

- 6th <u>Voter ID Runoff Affidavit Ballot Deadline, 5:00 p.m.</u>: Last day affidavit voters who cast an affidavit ballot by reason of voter ID may present an acceptable form of photo ID or complete an affidavit of religious objection in the Circuit Clerk's Office. (*MS Const.* 1890 § 249-A)
- **Declaration of Results by Secretary of State**: Deadline by which MSOS shall ascertain the whole number of votes given for certain candidates and declare such person(s) to be duly elected. (MS Code Ann. § 23-15-605)
- 9th Canvass of Returns and Declaration of Runoff Election Results by County Election Commission(s) Deadline: County Election Commission(s) transmit to the Secretary of State their counties' Runoff Election returns, including certified recap sheets and

statement of the whole number of votes given in the county for each candidate. The certification of the election must be signed and dated by a majority of the county election commissioners. (*MS Code Ann. §23-15-601, 23-15-603, §§ 140 and 143 of MS Const. of 1890*) No candidate shall be certified as elected to office unless and until he/she files all required campaign finance reports. (*MS Code Ann. § 23-15-811*)

Meeting of Electors: Electors nominated by the party shall meet in Jackson to give their votes for President and Vice-President of the United States, and shall make return thereof agreeably to the laws of the United States. (*MS Code Ann. § 23-15-789*)
